This course provides instruction and practice in advanced skills, strategies, and physical conditioning for students competing in intercollegiate women's soccer. Emphasis is placed on team tactics, game preparation, and competitive performance in accordance with the standards of the California Community College Athletic Association (CCCAA). Students represent the college in scheduled intercollegiate competitions and are required to attend practices, games, and team meetings.

- Exhibit personal and team responsibility, including punctuality, discipline, leadership, and effective communication within the team setting.
- Analyze and reflect on game performance through video review, coach feedback, and self-assessment to identify areas for improvement.
